### Remote Online Home Learning Policy - Guidance for Parents

Home Learning at Early Years will be a fun and engaging approach to learning through the predominant means of the Google Classroom. Through this online facility both children and parents will have access to videos, downloadable resources, set class activities, online links to school subscribed learning apps as well as teacher support and feedback.

We recognise that our young learners will need support from home and aim to ensure that work set is accessible and appropriate for the age of the child. Parents, teachers and TA's will work closely together to ensure regular communication takes place during periods of school closure. This will happen through a variety of forums: Phone call, conference call, email, Google Classroom and ILD. We welcome your feedback about how the Remote Online Home Learning is going once the school is closed.

- Please note Year 1 should follow the guidance set in the Remote Primary Home Learning document.
- Please note that for Reception Classes 'Creative time' will include lessons and activities set by the PE, Music and Thai teachers.
- Please note that PN & N 'Creative time' will be craft based, cooking and physical activities.

Although suggested 'learning times' are recommended in each of the Google Classrooms, we appreciate that parents will have to adapt home learning depending on personal circumstances and ability of each child to adjust to their 'Remote Home Learning' environment. In each Google classroom there is guidance of how long a child should spend in each area of learning, please remember that every child is different!

Take some time to understand Google Classroom. We will be sending home login information for your child's Google Classroom soon. Please login and check it works. Please check out the [presentation](#) if you need some help.



**Things that should be prepared to ensure your child has the best home learning experience:**

- Sign the 'Gmail' consent form.
- Check you can access all your online logins ILD as well as Bug Club and Education City (for Reception & Year 1 only).
- Join Twinkl for a one month free trial - [www.twinkl.co.uk/offer](http://www.twinkl.co.uk/offer) enter code **THATWINKLHELPS**
- Join for a 20-day free trial to [www.scholastic.com/learnathome](http://www.scholastic.com/learnathome).
- Check your email daily for regular updates
- Set up a quiet study space at home.
- Prepare some home learning resources - paper, coloured paper, glue (white and clear), pens, pencils, paints & brushes, sharpener, rubbers, string, elastic bands, stapler, craft accessories (MR DIY has a great supply), flour, glycerin of borax (available at Tesco), hair conditioner, fabric conditioner, corn starch, salt, food colouring, construction activities, dress up and role play equipment (you can always use the real thing - saucepans from your kitchen make a great toy drum) a ball, bean bag, skipping rope or hoop. Collect recycles (these are great for creative and imaginative craft activities).
- Access to a printer.

**Once the school has closed for normal lessons be prepared to:**

- Login to your personal email to check for school updates
- **Login in to Google classroom every day to follow the videos and activities posted by the class teacher/subject teacher**
- Be ready to complete your timetable everyday and actively participate in the learning - singing songs, copying actions, making, creating and speaking.
- Expect to complete tasks as usual and share with the class teachers for feedback and marking. Don't forget to post videos, work and photos on ILD, teachers will check daily for communication.
- Create a daily routine that works for you and your family, including break times.
- Enjoy doing daily chores together to encourage physical development and independence
- Praise the children regularly and use a reward chart for all of their hard work - you can link this to the BIST learner profile (Teamwork, Kindness, Positivity, Risk Taker, Determination, Reflective, Independent & Curious).
- Monitor the amount of screen time your child is exposed to.
- Ask questions - parents can ask for support in both English and Thai.
- Keep in regular contact with your child's teacher and the school.
- Be active and have fun!
