# AN OVERVIEW OF 6TH FORM

## The Sixth Form

Students now study a narrow curriculum. The timetable allows for 4 subjects to be chosen.

### AS (Yr 12)

- Most students will sit AS exams at the end of Yr 12 - this effectively gives them half an A-Level.
- Students are encouraged to choose 4 subjects to show breadth.

### Diploma

- Takes 2 yrs to complete
- Does not have any exams
- Assessment is project based
- Accepted internationally
- Is more about practical skills and the application of knowledge.
- Can be mixed with AS / A-Levels

# AN OVERVIEW OF 6TH FORM



- It is fast!
- Curriculum is more narrow - 3 or 4 subjects
- Each student is carefully guided through the university process - more closely in Year 13
- Organisation is the key to success
- Preparing students for life at University - and beyond

# ACADEMIC STUDIES

- Study periods - fostering independence
